THE HISTORY OF CHRISTCHURCH UNITED

Christchurch United remains one of the most decorated clubs in the history of New Zealand football.

The club's place in the history books came shortly after its inception with multiple national league and Chatham Cup titles in the 1970s and 1980s, and has continued into the present day with its extensive recent development and lofty aspirations for the future.

The club was formed via the merger and support of several Christchurch clubs in the early 1970s, ostensibly to provide a strong Christchurch team for participation in the New Zealand National Soccer League. The teams involved were Christchurch City AFC, Western AFC, Shamrock, and Christchurch Technical, though some of these sides continued to play on as separate sides after the formation of United. As a result of a sponsorship deal it was known as Trans Tours United from 1976 to 1978.

Winning the country's national league title and the Chatham Cup six times each, Christchurch United's history of success in New Zealand football is indisputable.

The club enjoyed a golden run beginning in the 1972 Chatham Cup final against Mount Wellington, still considered the most dramatic final in the long illustrious history of the knockout tournament. United's first national league title in 1973 was followed up by a Chatham Cup victory in '74, followed by a historical 1975 season. That season, Christchurch United became the first New Zealand club to win the national league and Chatham Cup final in the same year.

The record-breaking side, coached by Terry Conley, featured a number of well-renowned players including Ian Park, Roy Drinkwater, Bill Amey and Ken France, to name only a few.

The side of the 70s and 80s catapulted Christchurch United into domestic stardom in the game of football. Many of its players went on to represent New Zealand against international teams - a feat repeated throughout the decades as some of Christchurch's top talents came through the blue and white uniform.

The culture of winning and ambition of the club was put in place early and continued after a quiet spell in the late 80s, as a new breed of United players began coming to the fore.



THE HISTORY OF THE ACADEMY

Happy 9 Year Anniversary to the United Sports Centre!

On Saturday 18th March 2014, the Christchurch Football Centre developed this world class facility along Yaldhurst Road that has been the home of the Christchurch Football Academy.

Opening its doors for the very first time. Amazing just how much evolution has happened within the Academy and facilities in the last 9 years.

Then two years later in 2016 Christchurch United (CUFC) cemented the future of the Club after merging with the rapidly growing Christchurch Football Academy (CFA).

The merger between CFA and CUFC reignited the legacy and at the end of the 2016 season Christchurch United relocated to the then Christchurch Football Centre.

Diego Lavin From Christchurch United to Spanish Football!



I played for Christchurch United for eight years, playing various positions to where I play now as a left back. Im in Spain right now looking to sign for a Spanish club.

Ive gone through the whole Christchurch United pre-academy, then the academy right up to the under 20s. I chose to come over to Christchurch United right at the very start, as I was playing for another Christchurch club at the time and I remember we played a game against Christchurch United football Academy and we got beaten, we got beaten quite badly and I thought this was a really good club to be a part of, so I came along and I liked it a lot and so I stayed. I love the coaches and the players are really good as well, it was really good environment for me. So even though I was quite young at that point, I still saw what the club was trying to do and what they were doing and that's something that stuck

Q: What did you learn through Christchurch United's Academy?

A: A lot of the fundamentals of football and how to apply yourself on the pitch and make better decisions, it's a really good environment as you moved from pre-academy phase into the actual Academy itself and then all the way up 17s and 20s.

As it started off from the fundamentals, like wall control or 1V1's, it just got more complex throughout the years.

We've also had so many different coaches that are all really good, so it's more more about thinking before you get the ball, about the tactics of the game and knowing how to analyze yourself, your team and your moment


