PHOENIX RESERVES



The Wellington Phoenix Reserves have been playing at National League level for the past decade and have helped launch the careers of several of New Zealand's top professional footballers.

The Phoenix Reserves, which is almost entirely an under-20 men's team, first played in the old New Zealand Football Championship in the 2014/15 season after New Zealand Football granted Aotearoa's only professional club entry into the competition so the Nix could develop its up and coming male players.

Former USA international Tyler Boyd was the team's top goal scorer in their maiden season, while European-based All Whites Liberato Cacace, Sarpreet Singh, Joe Bell, Ben Waine, James McGarry and Max Mata are amongst the hundreds to have come through the club's academy programme in the past 10 years.

Wellington Olympic players Ben Mata, Hamish Watson, Jack-Henry Sinclair, Joel Stevens and Lukas Halikias are some of the Reserves' other notable alumni.

Club legend Chris Greenacre has been coaching the Phoenix Reserves for the past three years and has helped Lukas Kelly-Heald, Alby Kelly-Heald, Fin Conchie, Isaac Hughes, Matt Sheridan, Fergus Gillion, Luke Supyk and Gabriel Sloane-Rodrigues secure their maiden contracts to join fellow academy graduates Finn Surman, Ben Old, Alex Paulsen, Sam Sutton and Oskar van Hattum in the current first team squad.

Greenacre guided the reserves to second in the 2023 Central League and eighth place in last year's National League Championship.

DID YOU KNOW?

The R4 six goals in the 6-1 win versus Stop Out were the most we have ever scored at that Hutt Park. We had previously won 5-0 in 2020, 4-1 in 2008 and who could forget the 4-2 win to clinch the Central League Championship in 2016

It is the second match in a row we have scored six against them (we won 6-3 at Wakefield to clinch the League last August). The record was seven goals in a 7-0 win at Centennial Park (now known as Dave Farrington Park) way back in 1988 which included a Chris Christie-Yiavasis hattrick

Despite the win, we still have a losing record against Stop Out at Hutt Park with 9 wins, 4 draws and 10 defeats

The R2 3-5 loss to Wests broke a run of 7 consecutive wins against them stretching back to 2021

The five goals conceded in the Wests match was the

most at home since the Chatham Cup loss to Wairarapa United in 2018 when Paul Ifill and Hamish Watson were playing for the opposition

The R1 3-0 win against Napier City Rovers was the 11th consecutive win against them and the 7th in a row at Park Island

The R3 Waterside Karori match featured a duo (Justin Gulley and Tam Dimairo) who had both scored one or fewer goals after 72 matches breaking the previous record of 71 matches held by the pair Shayne Heathcote and Basil Vrizonis in 2000

Tor Davenport Petersen made his 100th start against Waterside Karori in his 106th match

Samuel Mitrakas made his 40th substitute appearance against Stop Out with only Jimmy Haidakis (46) and Spiros Androustos (52) having come off the bench more.
