CAPITAL PREMIER – TAYLOR HALL-JONES



After a string of good results the Cap Prem squad went to Maidstone Park to take on Upper Hutt, a fixture that is notoriously difficult to win.

We knew it would be a hard earned three points and the youthful squad was desperate for a result.

This year we have formed an alliance U17s team with Island Bay United.

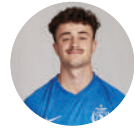

The promotion will be a step up for the lads, but it is the perfect step for their development into senior football

and the goals both we and IBU have for this group with the aim of playing in the National Youth League at the end of the year. So far, the attitude of the players has been really positive and their eagerness to grow is exciting to see.

Our first game in the CDL is against the Nix Women's Reserves tomorrow at Wakefield Park 1 at 10.45am. A big thanks goes to Matt Calcott for assisting me with coaching, and to Terry Fraser for all his admin work and helping to manage the team.

OLYMPIC JUNIORS – SAM MITRAKAS



This weekend marks Round 4 of the Junior season already.

A big thanks goes out to all our coaches and managers who have put in a lot of work and time so far with the kids. I would also like to thank PK, Matt, Nina and Anna-Maria for all their support in helping me to get the juniors up and running this year.

We have eight teams from U9-U13, which is basically double from what we had last season, so great to see the junior space growing.

Our U13s is a new team coached by Nates Grieg and are currently doing well in the Regional A league. It's a big step up from playing 9-aside to full field, normal 11 v 11 football with full sized senior goals.

We now have two U9 teams with Raf de Gregorio and Gianni Bouzoukis coaching a team each. Another two U10 teams are coached by Chris Kotrotsos and Adam Bertos, an U11 team co-coached by myself and Anthony Neonakis, and two U12 teams taken by Simon George and Merlin Luke-Miny.

Goodluck to Adam's U10 team and Simon's U12 team competing in the Wynton Rufer Tournament tomorrow.

Across the board there have been a lot of promising results so far with a lot of the teams playing in high

Regional leagues which is really good to see and is a credit to the players/coaches.

Our U7s and U8s have also grown this year with many more kids now participating in this setup. We are really thrilled to be fielding three U8 teams and one U7 team. This year we host our own in-house U7 and U8 football sessions, held on Saturday mornings at Sinclair Park. Every third Saturday our teams play in Capital Football's Festival Football days where we face other local U7 and U8 clubs. These are 5-aside games with 4 back-to-back games of 12 minutes each. The football rules are minimal and the idea is that the players play "street style" football to give them exposure to the game, confidence, with the emphasis on having fun.

Co-coaches Maki Halikias and Jimmy Haidakis are in charge of both these age groups, with support from Bruno Mouche. For the Festival Days, they each cover an U8 team, with Ben Mata helping out with the U7s. We are grateful to other senior players from the Club who are coming down and helping out as well. This is usually the first football experience for these young players and we are so lucky to have such good coaches getting involved and being part of their journey.
