WELCOME TO WAKEFIELD

CHAIRPERSON'S WELCOME – PAUL KOTROTSOS



I'd like to welcome both Upper Hutt and Stop Out to Wakefield today. Two tough assignments for both our teams.

Stop Out inflicted our first loss of the season in the league and we hope to reverse that result today. In fact a win for us today could wrap up the title for us and making history as the first Club to win the Championship Title three times in a row.

It was a disappointing loss in the quarter final of the Cup to a top Auckland side, Eastern Suburbs. Quite a few talking points and interesting decisions, I must add, that could have had a different outcome. It was also a good gauge to see where we stand in preparation for the National League round later in the year. We did however bounce back and finally win the O'Brien Shield last weekend against North Wellington and Tam scored his first goal (be it a penalty) for the club – congrats!

Upper Hutt will be no mean feat for our Capital Premier squad, sitting on top of the table, it's a must win to stay ahead of Island Bay. Stu Jacobs has a strong outfit who never give up.

Last week the team played at Seatoun Park - the surface was awful. I should have bought a lotto ticket as I probably had a better chance of winning a prize than trying to play constructive football on that ground.

The referees have taken a tough stance on verbal abuse on the field in recent weeks and have handed out several Red Cards to several clubs. We don't need this in our game and I remind all players, coaches and supporters to please think twice before opening your mouth and voicing anything that is inappropriate and unacceptable. This stern reaction from referees extends to the behaviour and inappropriate language (abusive or homophobic slurs) by supporters and other spectators watching the game and they have the authority to deal with the situation (warnings first, then request for spectator to be removed) while the game is paused. If the behaviour/inappropriate language continues, the referee will abandon the game altogether. The Club nor the teams should be victimised for a person who is only at the Park to cause an upset, so we ask our supporters to also be vigilant and to help us with any problematic spectators at the game.

Wellington Olympic has now been confirmed into the National League Championship which kicks off on the

23rd September. Once we have the draw, we'll get this up onto our website and media platforms. Congratulations to Rupert, Taylor and all the coaching staff, and to all the players. It has been an extremely long two years for them, as they have gone year round with trainings and games. Last December they barely had time to hang up their boots after their National League Grand Final in Auckland when they were back in training mode in early January readying themselves for the OFC National League Play-offs against eventual OFC Champions, Auckland City, Olympic being the first local Club to ever do so. By the time that final whistle blew, the team geared themselves up for the beginning of the Central League season.

We want our lads to know how much we appreciate everything they give up and do for the Club. It's a big ask every week to perform at the bar they have set, and the fact that Olympic is looking in good shape to make it No. 3 for the Title, is an incredible feat. And as records keep breaking, for a little Club with a whole lot of Greek passion, pride and heart, this squad has taken Olympic to heights not even dreamed of, let alone hope for, and made our flag fly so much higher...

Congratulations to our Wellington 1 Division team – Olympic 4ths – who were presented with the Champions Trophy for round 1. They're on a clear path to picking up their second at the end of the season and a promotion to Capital 4 for the 2024 season.

And Olympic TFTs Master's player, Bevan Smith, made it 100 goals for the Club last weekend when he scored his 20th for the season. Congratulations Bevan!

This week's round of 16 at the WWC have been so good. It's really lifted the profile of the Women's game and the crowds have been brilliant. It's hard to pick a winner with so many big guns already eliminated – my Semi Final picks – Netherlands, Sweden, Australia and England.

Good luck to all the teams.

I hope to see you all back in the Clubrooms after the match - players, supporters and referees all welcome.

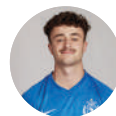
Week 16 the TFT's were back at home on Wakefield Park, but on pitch 4 rather than one of the lovely new

The boys have found some better form in the last few weeks and the wider squad have stepped up and delivered.

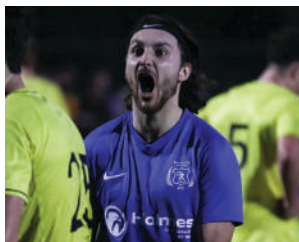


A 1-0 win against the Nix Women's Reserves gave us our first win since we beat the Nix boys a month ago.
