Well done to all those involved and the hard work that has gone into this campaign. A big thank you to Rupert and Scoota and all the coaching staff for your efforts over the last two seasons. You've firmly put this little but proud Club on the map with Titles and bringing

Last weekend saw us take on Auckland City in what was a prelude to the grand final in little over a week's time. In a game where both teams had secured a grand final berth, there was still plenty to play for and we were itching to get our hands on more silverware, this time the Mediterranean Cup.



The Wellington Phoenix Reserves have been playing at National League level for the past decade and have helped launch the careers of several of New Zealand's top professional footballers.

The Phoenix Reserves, which is almost entirely an under-20 men's team, first played in the old New Zealand Football Championship in the 2014/15 season after New Zealand Football granted Aotearoa's only professional club entry into the competition so that the Nix could develop its up and coming male players.

Former USA international Tyler Boyd was the team's top goal scorer in their maiden season, while Europeanbased All Whites Liberato Cacace, Sarpreet Singh, Joe Bell, Ben Waine, James McGarry and Max Mata are amongst the hundreds to have come through the club's academy programme in the past 10 years.

Wellington Olympic players Ben Mata, Hamish Watson, Jack-Henry Sinclair, Joel Stevens and Lukas Halikias

are some of the Reserves' other notable alumni.

Club legend Chris Greenacre has been coaching the Phoenix Reserves for the past two years and has helped Lukas Kelly-Heald, Fin Conchie, Isaac Hughes and Luke Supyk secure their maiden professional contracts this season to join fellow academy graduates Finn Surman, Ben Old, Alex Paulsen, Sam Sutton and Oskar van Hattum in the current first team squad.

Greenacre guided the Reserves to third in the 2022 Central League and an impressive sixth place in last year's National League Championship.

This year the Phoenix Reserves finished a clear second behind Wellington Olympic in the Central League and were one of the only teams to challenge the runaway champions.

The Reserves sit eighth entering the final round of the 2023 National League, having won back-to-back matches to give themselves a chance of repeating last year's sixth place finish.









### A CENTURY FOR GIANNI





Just over two minutes into the National League Championship match against Christchurch United on 4th November 2023, Gianni Bouzoukis drilled the ball into the bottom corner from just outside the box to give Olympic the lead in this crucial encounter.

A great start for the team who went on to win 5-2, but also an historic moment for Gianni as he became the first Wellington Olympic player to reach the 100 goal milestone in nearly a quarter of a century. Only Harry Kotsapas (1983, 223 matches) and Chris Christie-Yiavasis (2001, 253 matches) had previously made it to 100 goals for the Club. Gianni achieved it in a mere 127 matches including 16 goals in 17 matches in the National League Championship and including only 2 penalties.

Gianni is a second generation Olympic player, being the son of Basil Bouzoukis who played 151 times for the Olympic first team between 1978 and 1991. Unlike

his father, who was a defender, Gianni is a proven goal scorer.

In 2014 as a 15 year old, he played 7 times (twice as starter) for the Olympic Reserves in Capital Premier finding the net against Waterside Karori.

Over the following summer he played National League football with the Wellington Phoenix Reserves making three substitute appearances in a squad that featured current Olympic players Joel Stevens, Tam Dimairo, Justin

Gulley, Nathaneal Hailemariam and Merlin Luke-Miny.

In 2015 for the winter season, Gianni transferred to Wellington United (Wellington Phoenix's foothold in the local leagues at that time) playing mostly for their Venus Shield winning first team in Capital Premier where he made an impact scoring 11 times in 15 appearances (7 starts) making him equal 7th top scorer in the league at only 16 years old.

As a sign of things to come Gianni hit 4 goals for Wellington Phoenix Youth against Hawke's Bay Youth in the opening round of the National Youth League in October 2015 finishing the season with 10 goals in 11 matches.

For the 2016 winter season Gianni, now 17, returned home and became cap #424 for the Wellington Olympic 1st team, debuting in a 2-1 win at Fraser Park against Lower Hutt City. He showed that he wasn't out of place at this level by scoring both goals in a 2-1 win over Western Suburbs at Wakefield in his third match. By the

end of the season, he was Olympic's top scorer with 8 goals (already 2 more than his father Basil scored throughout his Olympic career) in 14 Central League matches and a League winner's medal although he missed out on playing in the 4-2 clinching win in the season finale against Stop Out due to suspension having received a 5th yellow fouling Justin Gulley against Wellington United in the previous match. Gianni missed most of the 2017 Central League after recovering from surgery only playing 5 of the last 6 matches of the season scoring 3 times. He also scored 5 times in 5 games for the reserves including his first hattrick for Olympic in a crucial 4-3 win over Petone that helped the team avoid relegation. Once again, he played National League with Wellington Phoenix Reserves where he remained goalless in 7 appearances (2 starts) plus a couple of matches for Wellington Phoenix Youth without adding to his goal tally.

Gianni also missed the start of the 2018 and 2019 seasons due to a stint at college in the United States. In 2018 he played his first league match in Round 8 - the shock loss to Havelock North Wanderers - finishing with 4 goals in 8 matches. He also scored his first Cup goal in a 5-1 win over Petone and added a couple more against Island Bay United. In 2019 he had a disappointing solitary goal in 7 matches (only 3 starts). At this point in his Olympic career he had 19 goals in 38 matches - decent but not the stuff that legends are made of but all that was about to change.

The 2020 season was delayed due to Covid restrictions and only began in June. With Jack-Henry Sinclair now at the Club, Wellington Olympic were an attacking force to be reckoned with. Gianni wasted no time and scored in each of the first 5 games of the season before going on to score his first 1st team hattrick and in so doing, break the individual league record for Olympic by scoring 5 in an 8-1 demolition of Wairarapa United. In all he hit 16 goals in 17 matches edging Jack-Henry who finished on 14 goals placing him 3rd in the Central League behind Sam Mason-Smith and Jesse Randall. He reached the 50 game milestone in the 2-3 loss to Waterside Karori with 33 goals to his credit (which placed him 4th after 50 matches at the time but has since dropped to 5th) The goals kept coming in 2021 with hattricks against Wairarapa United and Petone. He hit 16 goals for the second season running albeit in 20 matches (including the Cup and the South- Central Series). With Jimmy Haidakis finally retiring from the 1st team, Gianni was able to grab the number 10 jersey which Jimmy had monopolised for well over a dozen years (temporarily held in 2017 by Luis Corrales and in 2019 by Seth Ward when Jimmy was injured). With Kailan Gould's stunner edging out Miramar Rangers for the League title, Gianni bagged a second Central League winner's medal. Olympic qualified for the new club-based National League but due to Covid issues in Auckland, had to settle for the substitute South-Central Series. Olympic reached the final where Gianni scored but it wasn't enough in a 2-7 defeat to Miramar Rangers.

2022 was a sensational year for both the team and Gianni. After 7 matches Gianni only had 3 goals but tore Seatoun apart scoring 4 goals in an 8-0 Cup onslaught to avenge a 1991 defeat by the same opponents. He failed to score in the next game against Miramar Rangers but then reeled off 8 goals over 7 consecutive matches - that scoring streak is third equal overall (behind Geoff Brown with 11 matches in a row and Harry Kotsapas with 9). He added his 5th and 6th hattricks against Napier City Rovers and Western Suburbs respectively - the latter being in a record breaking 11-1 win at Endeavour Park. This took him level with Geoff Brown and Mickey Malivuk.

Olympic's Cup run ended in the semi-final with a loss to Auckland City and resulted in the League decider against Miramar Rangers, scheduled for that day, being postponed a few weeks. Another 1-0 win with Connor Gaul scoring the winner meant that Olympic had secured back to back titles and now Gianni, together with Scott Basalaj and Alex Palezevic, had three Central League winner's medals. Gianni played all 18 League matches and scored 16 goals – second only to Hamish Watson who scored 20 for Miramar Rangers.

Wellington Olympic's first match of the National League Championship phase since 1994 was a milestone for Gianni - his 100th for the 1st team. He became the 32nd centurion and the second father-son combo to achieve that after Imre Foldi and Chas Lawrence. The game was against Auckland City out at Endeavour Park (the Wakefield turf was being replaced), Fittingly, Gianni scored our first National League Championship goal after all those years but it wasn't enough to secure a result after a late own-goal saw Olympic succumb 1-2. Gianni made it 4 goals in 3 matches to start the campaign with a double up in Hamilton against Melville and one down in Christchurch against Cashmere Technical.

In all he managed 9 goals in the 9-round robin matches giving him a share of the golden boot. Unfortunately, Auckland City proved too clinical again for Olympic in the final and Gianni added a National League runners-up medal to his collection. All in all he had 32 goals in 34 matches for the season - a mark only bettered by Geoff Brown in 2004 who had 35 goals in 22 matches.

After the National League final Gianni went overseas to try out in the Finnish professional league. Unfortunately,



it didn't work out and he returned to New Zealand carrying an injury which delayed his return to the field. While Gianni was in Finland, Olympic missed out to Auckland City for Oceania Champions League qualification so the target now for 2023 was a 3-peat in the Central League and a National League title.

After two substitute Central League appearances, Gianni made his first start of the season in the Cup against Wainuiomata. After a mere 28 minutes he had his 7th hattrick giving him the outright club record. He followed this up by matching Mickey Malivuk's record of scoring consecutive hattricks when scoring 4 goals in a record breaking 7-0 rout of Miramar Rangers at David Farringdon Park in the Central League.

Gianni took a mid-season break at the end of July and missed the Chatham Cup quarter final loss to Eastern Suburbs. By the time he returned for the final league match against Western Suburbs, the Central League was already secured and he had a fourth winner's

medal – matched only by Scott Basalaj. In a stop-start season he only had 5 league goals in 8 matches (5 starts) plus 5 in 3 cup matches.

Refreshed after his break, he put Napier City Rovers to the sword in the National League with his 9th hattrick to extend his record - just missing out on the honour of scoring the 100th hattrick for the club which went to Jack-Henry Sinclair minutes later.

It was now a case of when, not if, Gianni would reach the 100 goal milestone this season. After goals against Eastern Suburbs and Auckland United took him to 98, he had two chances to reach the magical figure in front of his home crowd. He scored early against Petone to take him to 99 but couldn't add to that. Expectation was high for the Christchurch United match and Gianni didn't waste any time scoring as the teams were still being announced on the loudspeaker.
